Brief Description of Research Project	Transportation projects have costs and benefits that affect society, which are beyond just the traditional economics such as materials, labor and maintenance costs. These social costs and benefits of transportation projects can include effects on the environment, health, equity, and the overall resiliency of the system, which are difficult to assess and rarely included in project cost assessments, particularly on small to modest size projects. The proposed project therefore aims at filling this gap by developing a relatively easy to understand and implement methodology and an associated user-friendly tool to assist transportation professionals in assessing full social costs and benefits of a project to better inform transportation decisions. Education, technology transfer and training are important components of the project scope.
